	Minnesota	Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) has no financial contract to provide services to FSET participants. FSET responsibility is with MN Dept of Employment and Economic Development (DEED), a separate State agency. One contract with City of Minneapolis “Close the Gap” employment project. Minnesota Refugee Assistance Agency
	Ohio	Ohio Department of Jobs & Family Services (ODJFS) has no contracts or agreements to provide services to FSET participants. Counties are responsible for contracting out their own FSET services.
	Wisconsin	Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services (DHFS) transfers FSET responsibility to Dept of Workforce Development. Counties turn over FSET administration to Local W-2 agencies (TANF privatized agencies). Tribal agencies administer FSET themselves.
Mountain Plains	Colorado	Colorado Department of Human Services (DHS) does not contract with any organization. Contracts are between counties and organizations since Colorado is a county-operated State. Examples: Workforce centers, Goodwill and community colleges.

Western	Alaska	Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development provides all services.
	Arizona	Arizona's Department of Economic Security, Employment Administration (EA) has oversight and administers the FS E&T Program.
	California	10 of the 24 FS E&T counties in California contract FSET services. None of the counties contract out all FSET services. Some of agencies contracted with include Department of Rehabilitation, Private Industry Council, Sacramento Employment and Training Agency and Workforce Investment One-Stop Centers.
	Guam	Guam Department of Health and Social Services, Division on Public Welfare works in coordination with the Agency for Human Resources and Development, Department of Labor, One-Stop Career Center and Guam Community College. There is an existing Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Guam Workforce Investment Board and the Guam One-Stop Career Center Partners that is under implementation to coordinate an island-wide workforce development effort.
